


#### The Fruits of Globalization

#### World Population Living in Extreme Poverty: 1820-2015

Extreme poverty is defined as living at a consumption (or income) level below 1.90 "international \$" per day. International dollars are adjusted for price differences between countries and for price changes over time (inflation).



#### The Future is Bright: Middle Class Dominance in 2030




Figures in parenthesis indicate the increase/decrease in the number of people in each category by 2030.





(Comparison average pre and post five years)




## Top 6 Export Markets Account for over 60% of total U.S. Ag Exports




## A Classic "long tail distribution"

Over 20 markets with more than \$1 billion in Ag Exports






#### **U.S. Total Merchandise Annual Trade Balance**

Total Trade Balance and Oil & Gas Trade Balance (2002-2020)




#### Real GDP per capita in 2011 US\$


Real GDP per capita is measured using US\$, inflation adjusted at prices of 2011. A single benchmark of 2011 makes these series suitable for studying the growth of incomes over time (but not for comparing income levels between countries over time).




## Relative GDP 2018

GDP - per capita (PPP) compares GDP on a purchasing power parity basis divided by population as of 1 July for the same year. Note: not all countries are listed on the x-axis.







#### Distribution of People Between Different Poverty Thresholds, China

Poverty thresholds are all in "international dollars" at constant 2011 PPP prices. This means all figures account for cross-country differences in price levels, as well as for inflation. Estimates rely on a combination of income and consumption data.





### U.S.-China Bilateral Trade Deficit






#### China Imports of U.S. Ag & Seafood Products




#### China v. India








